2.1 Overall (summary) project progress



Most parts of the reporting period under review were marred by the COVID regulations and restrictions, which were only eased during the second half of the year, in July 2021. As a result, most field-based activities were severely impacted as the project could not hold meetings and workshops that were requisite for most activities planned for 2021.

Despite all challenges, some important milestones were recorded as outlined below;

Output 1.1 Institutional landscape governance systems created and/or strengthened through participatory decision-making processes and knowledge sharing at the local level:

Some substantive progress was achieved despite delays and challenges relating to COVID-19 restrictions. The Accredited Entity (AE), in close partnership with the National Designated Authority (NDA), has developed ToRs and managed to contract consultants for the development of landscape investment plans and rolling out of awareness-raising programs.

A three-year service level agreement to mainstream EbA and landscape management concepts into the CBNRM Programme through technical assistance support to landscapes was signed with the Namibian Association of CBNRM Support Organisations (NACSO) in July 2021. NACSO' Institutional Development Working Group (IDWG) (NACSO-IDWG) was selected to spearhead activities under the said agreement and has to date, conducted awareness-raising meetings with communities in seven (7) out of the (13) targeted regions namely; Hardap, //Karas, Erongo, Oshana, Ohangwena, Omusati and Oshikoto. These awareness-raising meetings were attended by regional council members, farmers associations, conservancy associations, and decentralized line ministries. Further meetings are planned for the first quarter of 2022.

The AE, in close partnership with NACSO-IDWG and NDA, held regional workshops from August to September 2021 in seven (7) out of 13 political regions to create synergies amongst CBNRM CBOs, NGOs and decentralized to establish functional community-based forums that will rollout EbA interventions at sub-national and local levels. A total of sixty (60) participants were recorded of which 42% (25) are male and 58% (35) are female.

An external consultant (Namibia Technical and Business Consultants) was contracted to compile an informative training manual on ecosystem-based adaptation and its application for community-based organizations, NGOs, and government extension services. Training needs assessment survey was initiated amongst the NGOs and government extension staff to reflect and develop a representative and adaptive training manual. The manual has been submitted to NACSO-IDWG for finalization and standardization.

To fastrack the establishment of the EbA grants facility in targeted landscapes, two consulting companies (Mulla investment CC and Healthy Earth Environmental Consultants) were contracted to develop investment plans for eight (8) targeted landscapes. Eight (8) consultation workshops were held from the 3rd to the 25th September 2021 and attended by two hundred and seventy-four (274) participants representing key stakeholders constituting from farmers unions, conservancies, community forests, traditional authorities, regional councils, non-governmental organizations, extension services staff, youth groups, and community representatives. Workshop report integrated with investment plans attached as Annex 4.

The finalization of the investment plans was a cumbersome process but despite all setbacks, a validation workshop was held on the 27th of October 2021 with various stakeholders representing the Ministry of Environment, Forestry and Tourism (MEFT), Ministry of Agriculture, Water and Land Reform (MAWLR), NACSO, Namibia National Farmer's Union (NNFU), Ministry of Urban and Rural Development (MURD), Namibia University of Science and Technology (NUST) and University of Namibia (UNAM), inputs were incorporated and the final document is awaiting NDA and Project Steering Committee (PSC) approval during the first quarter of 2022.



Output 1.2: Institutional capacity enhanced for ecosystem landscape management and climate change resilience at sub-national and local levels:

Training needs assessments focused on EbA concepts were conducted by NACSO-IDWG, to establish capacity levels towards deployment of EbA approaches. The training needs assessments were carried out amongst NGOs, CBOs, development partner organizations, and government extension staff at sub-national and local levels. A training manual is developed and awaits NDA and PSC approval. Training of Trainers (ToT) workshops are scheduled for March 2022.

Output 2.1: Conservation of biodiversity and ecosystem strengthened through enhanced diversification income-generating activities and development of community livelihood enterprises.

The SAP006 project employs the same PSC as the FP024 project for oversight and approval of grants as outlined in the project document. Further, the AE's already existing and functional structures namely; Fund Management Committee (FMC), Technical and Advisory Panel (TAP), and Risk and Investment Committee (RIC), required for the assessment and approval of proposals will be utilized under the envisaged EBA grant facility. To this end, a reviewed Grants Award Manual (GAM) and templates have been updated and approved by AE as a small grant kit and await NDA and PSC approval.

Requisite training workshops directed at improving the capacity of targeted beneficiaries on EbA concepts, proposal development, and project management concepts were not executed due to due to COVID-19 restrictions that curtailed movements and restricted meetings and subsequent group sizes. However, the AE made deliberate efforts to ensure that introductory project management concepts and application processes for EIF-GCF grants were covered during the cluster-based investment plan development meetings. The project management-based meetings and trainings are scheduled for March 2022. The first call for a grants proposal is to be officially announced by EE (MEFT) by February 2022.

Output 3.1: Effective knowledge management results in informed decision-making at all levels through an integrated information system

The AE, under the guidance of the NDA, has initiated consultations with stakeholders on the mainstreaming of the EbA approach into national development plans. The consensus was reached to retain existing platforms currently being used by NACSO member organizations. Discussions are currently underway to incorporate EbA activities with sister projects and organizations implementing similar programs in Namibia. The institutions and projects that are earmarked for coordinating activities with are GIZ and GEF-funded Namibia Integrated Landscape Approaches for Enhancing Livelihoods and Environmental Governance to Eradicate Poverty (NILALEG) project which is implementing similar programs in EbA target landscapes.

Co-financing summary

Co-financing in this context is exclusively in-kind on the part of the NDA. As a result, no funds were physically received for project activities during the reporting period. To this end, activities undertaken on EE expense and expertise during the reporting period are related to the hosting of meetings and support rendered by regional offices during consultation workshops for eight (8) targeted landscapes.

Output 4.1: Monitoring and Evaluation

During the reporting period, the AE organized one (1) virtual PSC meeting held on the 26th of May 2021. During the first meeting, the PSC approved the project work plan, budget, and procurement plan for 2021. It was then deemed suitable that, to ensure that the PSC is abreast of the project implementation progress amid COVID-19 pandemic challenges, the PMU should continue to develop quarterly progress updates to the PSC. To this end, the PMU successfully held three progress update sessions with NDA and AE and submitted quarterly technical and financial progress reports to PSC. The 2020 financial audit was conducted in July 2021 and an unqualified independent financial audit report was submitted to GCF in September 2021.



Challenges experienced during the reporting period

1. COVID-19 Pandemic

- Coordination of the project activities was affected due to COVID-19 related challenges, for instance; various key institutions were temporally closed or restricted access to their offices for most of the first and second quarter.
- Field level activities and activities requiring participatory engagements with the targeted beneficiaries and stakeholders were delayed due to prolonged Covid-19 related regulations and restrictions that were only eased towards the latter part of the year.
- Adverse effects of COVID-19 on keyholders, consultants, and PMU to set meetings and travel. Although efforts were made to
 coordinate activities virtually, the turnaround times for decisions and approvals became lengthy as some stakeholders had no reliable
 internet connection.

The project has achieved minimal progress against the six GCF investment criteria due to challenges and delays reported in the previous APR (delays in the commencement of the project due to challenges associated with the fulfillment of pre-disbursement conditions and COVID-19 related challenges) that has had a knock-on effect on the implementation of activities. Further, the project continues to experience COVID-19 related challenges that have mostly hindered successful coordination and implementation of funded activities.

2.2.1 Impact Potential [2]

The key impact potential indicator, i.e. total number of direct and indirect beneficiaries with reduced vulnerability or increased resilience, remains the same as the initial baseline due to reasons indicated above under 2.2. However, most of the project's impact will be realized with the implementation of the small grants facility, the first call to be announced during the first quarter of 2022. To date, considerable efforts have been made (and are presently being made) with progress towards reaching the desired impacts as highlighted below:

• The AE created awareness on climate threats and related appropriate responses/interventions during the investment plan meetings and workshops held with various stakeholders in the eight (8) targeted landscapes in the third and fourth quarters of 2021. The workshops were attended by over two hundred and seventy-four (274) participants from various institutions namely; Regional councils, CBOs, NGOs, water points committees, Farmers Associations, and women groups. Further, the investment plan workshops empowered local and regional institutions to determine climate change adaptation and mitigation solutions that directly respond to their needs, vulnerabilities, and opportunities to be considered for possible funding under the the SAP006 small grants facility. About 60,000 direct beneficiaries (50% female and 50% male) and 156,000 indirect beneficiaries are expected to benefit through the small grants facility.



2.2.2 Paradigm shift potential

During the reporting period, minimal progress was made towards achieving desired paradigm shift for the same reasons indicated above under 2.2. However, the operational/administrative progress stated below is worth noting;

(a) Potential for scaling up and replication

- The project, through the introduction and implementation of the EbA concept is already a paradigm shift within the CBNRM program.
 The AE, in close partnership with NACSO-IWG and NDA, held regional workshops from August to September 2021 in seven (7) out of 13 political regions to create synergies and cooperation in the CBNRM fraternity. The meetings further served as platforms for sensitizing stakeholders towards the need for strengthening CBNRM Coordination in the regions while informing the regional political leadership and management about the EbA Project.
- Additionally, consultations and awareness workshops were conducted with regional conservancy associations and community forest
 associations to strengthen existing CBNRM forums in Northcentral Landscapes and Kunene South and Duares Landscapes (held in
 October 2021), and support the establishment of new CBNRM forums in Hardap and Karas regions (held in August 2021).
- The CBNRM forums will serve as a platform for information sharing in order to enhance the coordination of EbA concepts within the CBNRM program and its activities. The actual paradigm shift will be realized as the project is being executed.

(b) Potential for knowledge and learning

During the reporting, the project documented the development of investment plans and captured lessons on the importance of multistakeholder engagement and the utilization of existing structures with the view of increasing efficiencies during project implementation.

(c) Contribution to the creation of an enabling environment

The Namibian government through the Ministry of Environment, Forestry and Tourism (MEFT) in its capacity as the EE has provided enabling support through expertise rendered by regional staff during the development of investment plans and stakeholder meetings. Further the project has initiated foundational processes through engagements with the relevant national and regional institutions and CBNRM fraternity on the adoption and mainstreaming of EbA and landscape management concepts.

(d) Contribution to regulatory framework and policies

For the same reasons indicated above under 2.2; Activities under component 3, that directly contribute to this investment criteria were not implemented during the reporting period.

2.2.3 Sustainable development potential [2]

For the same reasons indicated above under 2.2, the investment criteria will only be assessed during the next reporting period. However, it is acknowledged that the project has strong sustainable development potential, and will directly contribute to SDGs 13, 14, and 15.

Operational processes have been initiated to support the strengthening of beneficiaries' capacities to ensure better investment in ecological infrastructures and ecosystem restoration activities that protect the environment. Similarly, investment plans have been developed to direct possible interventions that target landscape-based communities towards eradicating poverty and improving livelihoods and resilience amidst prevailing climatic conditions.

2.2.4 Needs of the recipient

The development of investment plan for the eight (8) targeted landscapes empowered and enabled natural resource-reliant communities to participate in the determination of climate change adaptation and mitigation solutions that directly respond to their needs, vulnerabilities, and opportunities, that will be considered for possible funding that under the SAP006 small grants facility.

2.2.5 Country Ownership

The SAP006 Project's alignment with Namibia's country's strategic, policy, and legislative framework has been adequately articulated in Section E5 of the approved funding proposal (Paragraph 136).



2.2.6 Efficiency and Effectiveness 🔞

- · Already existing CBNRM platforms accommodate and spearhead SAP006 interventions in target landscapes.
- The AE has streamlined efficiency through the adoption of financial management and reporting processes specifically for the GCF-funded projects to ensure timeous reporting and due diligence for the small grants facility.
- SAP006 and FP024 share a Monitoring and Evaluation Officer.
- SAP006 project share and attend platforms of sister organizations that implement similar landscape-based activities in target landscapes e.g GIZ and NILALEG project.
